Leading Art Dealers Join The 47th Annual Buxton Antiques Fair

12th – 15th May 2011

The Buxton Pavilion, St John's Road, Buxton, Derbyshire SK17 6BE

Two of Britain's leading fine art dealers will be exhibiting for the first time at The 47th Annual Buxton Antiques Fair at the Pavilion Gardens, from 12th – 15th May 2011.



Haynes Fine Art from Broadway have the largest stock of original 18th and 19th century paintings in the country while E.Stacey-Marks from Sussex and Yorkshire, are one of the UK's most prestigious and oldest art dealers in existence.

Organiser Sue Ede of Cooper Fairs, who took over the fair in 2009, is thrilled to have galleries with such high reputations joining the fair. 'It's a real honour,' explains Sue, these galleries add an extra dimension to this annual event, now in its 47th year. Both are very highly regarded dealerships and leading members of the British Antique Dealer's Association.'

These galleries join others showing at the fair, including Baron Fine Art from Chester, Benton Fine Art from Morton-in-Marsh, Jo Bennett from Manchester and Steve Marsling from Lancashire.

Also showing for the first time will be Derek Rayment Antiques, one of the UK's leading barometer specialists, and Mark West, the glass specialist who exhibits at fairs around the world.

High quality works of art and period furniture have always distinguished this famous annual event that attracts serious collectors and connoisseurs from across the Midlands and North of England. Specialist dealers offer a wide range of rare and desirable pieces with prices from less than £50 to more than £50,000. Buxton's famous Pavilion has been hosting this annual event for forty-six years and, once again, exhibits valued at more than £5million will be transforming this popular venue into a sumptuous palace of rare and valuable treasures.

A superb display of antique silver will feature on the stand of Yorkshire dealer Jack Shaw & Co. from Ilkley. Owner John Shaw promises a number of rare and interesting pieces including an impressive George III period silver coffee pot engraved with a crest and priced at £3,600; and a pair of similar period silver 'basket' shaped salts with eye-catching silver-gilt interiors, priced at £1,800.

Furniture specialist Anthony Butt from Hertfordshire promises a range of country pieces including chests of drawers, tables and chairs in oak and mahogany from the 18th and 19th century. S & S Timms from Bedfordshire also specialise in furniture and promise a number of Regency period pieces including a satinwood centre table, a mahogany chaise longue and a gilded convex mirror.

Among the specialist exhibitors will be Paraphernalia Decorative Arts from Buxton, specialising in Arts & Crafts furniture and lighting; Richard Glass from Derbyshire with Old Master drawings, John Newton from East Yorkshire, showing fine porcelain; M.& N.Oriental Rugs from Manchester and Garth Vincent from Lincolnshire, with a selection of antique arms and armour.

Also on sale will be early English pottery on the stand of Roger de Ville from Staffordshire; Persian and Oriental carpets and rugs from M.& N.Rugs from Manchester; and British and Continental porcelain by Meissen and other major factories, from specialist dealer John Newton from East Yorkshire. Among the jewellery specialists, Shapiro & Co. from London promise a glittering display of Russian and French pieces including pieces by Faberge.

Approximately fifty specialist dealers occupy room-set style stands within the charming setting of The Pavilion Gardens building, with its adjacent restaurant and coffee bar.

Everything Vetted

All exhibits on sale at the fair are vetted for quality and authenticity by a committee of experts. Exhibits are offered in a condition ready for people's homes and private collections. 'This ensures that buyers can make their purchases with confidence and is the mark of a good quality fair,' explains Sue, who appreciates that anyone who invests in fine quality antiques needs that kind of reassurance.
