*Taunton School is an independent co-educational school for day pupils aged 13 to18. Taunton School was founded in 1847 as a boy's only school for dissenters - those not members of the Church of England. In the 1870s, the school's governors purchased a site at the northern end of Taunton, on Staplegrove Road where they built an impressive gothic-influenced building, in the prevailing style of the period. This large building still dominates the school's 90-acre campus today. A chapel was built in 1907 in contrasting style to the rest of the school. Its sponsor was the wealthy Sir Henry Wills, later Lord Winterstoke. Wills was a director of Bristol-based family firm, Wills Tobacco. This company later joined with several others to become Imperial Tobacco.
